Ellen Lucille Fields (nee Perkins) passed away on April 2, 2024, at the age of 77 at her home in Lexington, Tennessee. She was born on September 11, 1946, in Brooklyn, New York.

Ellen grew up in Colorado Springs, Colorado and attended St. Mary's High School. Upon graduation, she moved to Denver, Colorado to attend nursing school at St. Joseph Hospital School of Nursing, earning her RN.
