Heaven received Linda just a few days before her celebration of 80 incredible years. She lived a full active life trying to bless others along her way. She was a faithful member of Rock Hill Baptist Church, and she loved missionary work. Linda and Eddie traveled many miles sharing the gospel of the Good News of God's salvation plan. She looked forward each year to teaching the children in Vacation Bible School. For years, Linda was Eddie's partner in youth and music ministry, and in her later years, she was very much involved in Senior Adult Ministry at several nursing homes.

Linda was an auxiliary member of the International Gideons placing Bibles in hospitals, schools, and prisons. She was a dedicated and committed volunteer to 4-H programs developing young leaders, even traveling to Canada with local National 4-H club winners.

Linda volunteered and worked as an election voting station leader for several years. She was a TSSAA sports official referee for Basketball and an umpire for Softball. Linda was an avid fan and follower of the Lexington Lady Tigers, the Union University Bulldogs, and the UT Lady Vols.

She loved traveling, meeting new people, and seeing new places. Linda especially loved to visit antique stores. For years, she scheduled road trips driving across the country with her sisters to visit family and friends. These road trips generated thousands of memories over thousands of miles, plus she came home with a few new antiques.

Known to most as Nana or Aunt Linda, her home was the family's gathering place for barbeque and lake days on the 4th of July, turkey feasts on Thanksgiving Day, the tradition of hog jowl and black-eyed peas on New Years Day, numerous birthday and graduation celebrations, and some very heated Rook tournaments with family. She loved hosting, cooking, playing games, and spending time with her family, who was her pride and joy.

A Celebration of her life and home going will be held at Reeds Funeral Home at 2:00 pm on Saturday, May 9th with the visitation from 6:00 to 8:00 pm Friday, May 8th and from 12:00 to 2:00 pm on the day of the service.

Later, We went in two's. Eddie or Linda and I went back to knock on those doors to try to talk to the ones who would understand our English and explain why we wanted their children to come with us.

Linda or Eddie would stand and pray and I never once felt afraid.

I knew God had us right in the palm of his hand and I know Linda is seeing the fruit of so many souls that she's reached with her efforts over the years of loving VBS children . I could go on forever. Rest in the arms of the Lord you love so much. Heaven gets sweeter every day.
