



Marian Ivean Duke

November 27, 1929 - November 11, 2022

Marian Ivean Duke, known to many as “Dee Dee”, passed away on November 11, 2022 at Decatur County Rehabilitation surrounded by family. She was 92 years, 11 months and 15 days old. Mrs. Duke was born in Shelby County to the late Rudgil and Mary Smith. She was one of six children all of which were girls and has since been preceded in death by all but one sister. Mrs. Duke attended Memphis State University with a degree in education and retired in 1985 from Lexington High School. She loved speaking of and seeing all of her “former students” and would usually recognize them as such. Along with her parents, Mrs. Duke was preceded in death by her husband of 70 years, Otis Duke; and 4 sisters, Ardel Jolly, Yolanda Mae Delashmit, Noma Jean Wilson and Cleo Richards.
