Peggy Perry Chumney, 88, of Parsons, TN, passed away Monday, January 2nd, at Jackson-Madison Co. General Hospital.

She was a 1946 graduate of Crockett Co. High School, attended UT Martin, UT Knoxville and Memphis State University from 1946-1950 and 1959-1960 earning her BS and Masters Degree. She taught school for several years, was Decatur County Home Demonstration Agent, and she and her husband were owners of Sugar Tree Truck Stop in Holladay, TN.

Peggy was very active in her church and community, serving in various capacities at Parsons First United Methodist Church, UT Martin - Parsons Center, where she serves on the higher education committee and has a room named in her honor, a long time supporter of Bear Creek Baptist Church and Cemetery where she will be laid to rest.

She enjoyed traveling and seeing sites worldwide, where she made many friends along the way. Peggy was a wonderful person who received her greatest enjoyment from helping others.

She is survived by a host of close friends that were considered to her as family.

She was predeceased by her husband, Floyd Chumney, her son, Craig Perry Chumney, and her parents, Carl and Sarah Perry.

Her funeral service will be Friday, January 6th at 11 AM at Parsons First

United Methodist Church with Greg Taylor, John Holcomb, and Don Franks officiating. Burial to follow in Bear Creek Cemetery in Parsons.
